

## **MINUTES OF THE JUNE 22, 2022 REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING**

The following are the Minutes of the June 22, 2022 Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Pompton Lakes that was held in the Council Meeting room of the Municipal Building, 25 Lenox Avenue, Pompton Lakes, New Jersey and was called to order at 7:30 P.M.

Mayor Michael Serra opened the Meeting and led participants in saluting the flag.

Mayor Serra read the Open Public Meeting Law Statement of Compliance.

A Roll Call indicated the following members were present: Mayor Michael Serra, Council President Jennifer Polidori, Councilmen Erik DeLine, Bobby Cruz and Ekamon Venin. Councilman William Baig and Councilwoman Maria Kent were excused from the Meeting.

Also present were Borough Attorney, Mark Semeraro, Borough Administrator, Paula Cozzarelli and Borough Clerk, Elizabeth Brandsness.

### **MAYOR PRESENTATION AND UPDATES:**

### **MEETING OPEN FOR PUBLIC COMMENTS:**

Motion moved by Councilwoman Polidori, second by Councilman Cruz to open the Meeting for public comments. All voted in favor of the motion.

### **MARGARET KAFFKA, Ramapo Avenue**

Ms. Kaffka stated she was a member of both the Pompton Lakes Woman's Club and the Library Board and she would like to bring forth two concerns regarding the Library. Ms. Kaffka commented on the generous donation by the past Library Director, Dr. Freathy and stated the Woman's Club purchased a bench in memory of Dr. Freathy. Ms. Kaffka questioned when the bench would be anchored to a footing. Mayor Serra stated a private contractor has been contracted to pour the footing and anchor the bench.

Ms. Kaffka stated the front stairs of the Library entrance way has had yellow caution tape around them for several months and questioned when the stairs would be restored, as it is difficult to enter and exit the building. Mayor Serra questioned whether the Library Director notified the Administrator alerting of an issue with the stairs. Councilman DeLine stated there had been discussions in the past during Library Board Meetings regarding the restoration of the stairs. Mayor Serra requested the Borough Administrator, Ms. Cozzarelli, follow up with the Library Director, Michael Drazek, to inquire as to the issue with the front stairs.

**COUNCIL PRESIDENT POLIDORI:**

- Diane Gelok is resigning from her position as President of the Pompton Lakes Education Foundation and thanked Ms. Gelok for her service to the community. The Pompton Lakes Education Foundation (PLEF) has installed a new Board for the upcoming year.

- acknowledged graduating classes. Eighth grade class will be moving onto the High School and stated COVID had affected students during their time at Lakeside. Councilwoman Polidori stated the class was resilient and wished the students well as they enter High School.

- Boy/Girl Scouts events have resumed.
- participated in VFW Corn Hole Contest
- the July Rotary Golf Outing information can be found online
- Open Space *Name the Frog Contest* ribbon cutting will be held on June 30, 2022 at 6:00pm
- meeting with Engineer for Carlough Field and Lakeside to discuss upgrades to the area
- working on project with Laura Jennings along with the schools for a selfie station near the walking dock located by the Lake and inclusive park.

Mr. Semeraro commented on the agreements with the County for Shared Services for repairs and ownership for various bridges and stated the agreements were favorable and beneficial for the Borough.

Mayor Serra stated the DuPont Bridge has been an orphan bridge for many years and the terms within the agreement specifies the County of Passaic would assume ownership for the bridge.

**PAULA COZZARELLI, Borough Administrator**

Ms. Cozzarelli reported on the following.

- Fire Fighter Grant Opportunity – FY 2022 American Rescue Money -- Ms. Cozzarelli stated Governor Murphy announced the State of New Jersey is appropriating \$10 million to support the purchase of firefighter equipment. Ms. Cozzarelli stated the fund focuses on volunteers and mutual aid and she has contacted the Fire Chief for input.
- FEMA-DAC Category Z- 5% reimbursement administrative costs. Contacted grant writers to verify status for the Borough.
- spoke with contractor paving Ringwood Avenue and the project (mill/pave) is scheduled to start after July 4, 2022
- Open Space – submission deadline extended to June 2023. Formal request to be made.
- Shade Tree – pruning and removal list for trees. Ms. Cozzarelli stated the trees at the Library were diseased and hollow.
